

The HYArmy provides students with tailored opportunities to explore pathways into careers such as the Armed Forces, Police, Fire Service and other public service roles. Members will take part in specialist careers sessions, workshops and events designed to give them a clear insight into the skills, qualifications and experiences needed for success in these fields.

Already, HYArmy members have attended a public services workshop, taken part in a Remembrance parade, and benefited from a visit from the Royal Artillery, who spoke to students about career routes, training opportunities and life within the Armed Forces.

Mrs Ross explained: *"The HYArmy is about supporting students who already have an interest in serving their communities. By giving them access to focused careers guidance and real-world experiences, we can help them make informed decisions and prepare for exciting futures in public service."*

This initiative reflects our commitment to providing personalised careers education and ensuring every student has the opportunity to explore pathways that match their ambitions.

Going forward, HYArmy members will continue to benefit from exclusive careers sessions, guest speakers from public service organisations and visits to relevant employers and training providers.



Inspiring Future Healthcare Professionals

BAE Systems STEM Roadshow inspires our students

We were delighted to host the BAE Systems STEM Roadshow, delivered in partnership with the Royal Air Force and Royal Navy. This engaging event provided an invaluable opportunity for our Year 7 and Year 8 students to explore the exciting world of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM).

The theme of this year's roadshow focused on Artificial Intelligence (AI) and its growing influence on the modern world. Students enjoyed interactive demonstrations, including the highlight of the day – an AI-powered robotic dog capable of performing complex movements and responding to commands. Students also experimented with AI technology to create their own music and videos, combining creativity with innovation.



The roadshow aimed to broaden students' understanding of STEM careers and the skills required for future opportunities in industries such as aerospace, engineering and technology.

Mrs Ross, Careers Advisor, commented: "Events like this are invaluable for inspiring students and showing them the real-world applications of STEM. It helps them see how their interests can lead to exciting careers in technology and engineering."

Adelle, Year 7, shared her thoughts: "I loved the roadshow, especially the robotic dog! It was amazing to see what technology can do. I want to learn more about how it works."

We extend our thanks to BAE Systems, the Royal Air Force, and the Royal Navy for delivering such an inspiring and informative experience. Opportunities like this encourage our students to think ambitiously about their futures and the role they can play in shaping tomorrow's technology.

Year 11 explore future careers at BAE Systems

Our Year 11 students enjoyed an inspiring visit to BAE Systems, where they explored future career pathways in engineering and defence. The visit included a presentation about the company's work, a look at current engineering projects, and a hands-on careers workshop highlighting the skills and qualifications needed in the industry.

Students also experienced an immersive VR Cave demonstration and visited apprenticeship stalls, where they spoke directly with industry professionals about different career routes. The visit was highly motivating, and we thank BAE Systems for providing such a valuable experience for our students.



Pride, Performance and Participation

It has been a busy and positive period for school sport, with our students showing fantastic determination, teamwork and resilience across a wide range of events.

Our Year 7 and Year 9 netball teams played their first fixtures of the year against a strong Clitheroe Grammar side. Both teams impressed with their attitude and effort, growing in confidence throughout the matches. Player of the Match awards went to Maggie A. (Y7) for her excellent defending in a new position, and Ella B. (Y9) for her strong defensive work and movement.

In football, our Year 7/8 girls competed in the Girls' Cup at Accrington Stanley Sports Hub, facing tough opposition including CRGS, Bowland and Mount Carmel. The team showed great progress in confidence and skill, particularly after a challenging opening match. Year 7 girls also took part in the Hyndburn & Ribble Valley tournament, supported by Year 8 students Madison S, Ellie-May B and Matilda H, who stepped in to help ensure the team could compete.

Our Year 8 athletics team represented the school at the Indoor Athletics competition, achieving some outstanding results. Highlights included Emmanuel A. winning three events, strong performances from Olly A, and a podium finish for Ellie-May B.

Cross country has also been a highlight this term. Following our House Cross Country event earlier in the term, a large group of students went on to represent the Academy at the District Cross Country at Witton Park in October. Thirty-seven students competed and behaved impeccably throughout the day. Ellie R. produced the best HYA performance in the Year 7 girls' race, finishing 26th, while Oscar P. was the first HYA runner home in the Year 7 boys' race. All Year 8/9 girls and boys completed the challenging 3.2km course, with many improving on last year's results. The Year 10 boys: Jack Y, Ryan R, Cohen H and Kai S completed the gruelling 4.5km race, with Kai achieving the strongest HYA finish in his category.

The Hyndburn Academy hosted the District U14 Badminton Championships, where Dylan M, Jack C, Harry J and Dean A competed against strong opposition. Despite it being their first appearance at this level, the team showed great resilience, secured several match wins and gained valuable experience for the future.

To round off a fantastic term of sport, our newly appointed Sports Leaders have led two HRVSSP primary school curling events. They demonstrated excellent leadership, organisation and communication skills, representing the school superbly and making a positive impact on younger pupils.

Well done to all students involved for representing the school with pride.



DofE Goes from Strength to Strength
