and issuing briefing notices at the start of the new term. These sessions will provide more detail and give you the chance to ask any questions.




## **Download our Parent App**

#### Rowing Success at the All Aboard Youth Regatta – Champions on the Water!

We are thrilled to share the outstanding achievements of our rowing teams at the All Aboard Youth Rowing Regatta, held this week at Warrington Rowing Club. Competing against over 30 schools, our students showed incredible determination, teamwork, and resilience in what turned out to be a truly memorable day on the water.

**Girls' Crew – Champions!** The girls' crew, made up of Natalie S., Essie G., Ally B., and Ella N., with Maisie G. as cox, had an incredible day. After a strong start in their first race, a minor setback when Ella "caught a crab" (a rowing term for when the oar gets stuck in the water) cost them a few seconds. However, the team quickly recovered and came back even stronger.

In their second time trial, the girls raced against a boys' crew and absolutely flew down the course. Spectators were amazed by their speed and fluency, with Maisie's coxing voice echoing down the river well before the boat came into view! Their time put them comfortably in first place, and no other crew came close in the final session. They finished 1st overall – an incredible achievement!

**Boys' Crew – Top Manchester Finishers!** The boys' crew – Dylan M, Cole M, Malachi B, and Jenson H, with Logan P. as cox – also had a fantastic day. They dominated their first race with speed and control, and although narrowly beaten by Marsden Heights in the second, their earlier time secured them 4th place overall – and 1st among Manchester schools!

**Special Recognition – Dylan M.** A huge congratulations to Dylan M., who was awarded the Graham Miller Trophy for personal growth and positive change. Selected from over 500 pupils, Dylan received his award from the Mayor of Warrington – a truly proud moment for him and the school.


